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How many MW of battery storage will be developed in Serbia?

Why should Serbia invest in solar power plants?

Located throughout the country, these solar power plants will help Serbia improve energy security, avoid expensive energy imports, and achieve electricity independence at an affordable price. Does Serbia have a solar project?

The contract is the latest in a line of solar projects backed by Serbia's Ministry of Mining and Energy this year, which includes plans for a 1 GW solar panel factory and another 500 MW of solar. Figures from the International Renewable Energy Agency state Serbia had deployed a total 137 MW of solar by the end of last year.

What type of energy is used in Serbia?

Energy in Serbia is dominated by fossil fuels, despite the public preference for renewable energy. In 2021 Serbia's total energy supply was almost 700 PJ, with the energy mix comprising coal (45%), oil (24%), gas (15%), and renewables (16%).
